

Formed in 2013, Fiati Five is a woodwind quintet that's rethinking chamber music, approaching each concert as a communal, joyful experience for musician and audience alike. We think of each concert as an educational opportunity – an opportunity to share music in a welcoming way and engage audiences on a personal level. Our repertoire champions newly-composed works, traditional quintet repertoire (especially works by American composers), and our own transcriptions of other classical and popular. Audiences should leave our concerts having heard something new, having heard something old in a new way, and feeling that classical music is accessible.

As the ensemble-in-residence at [Chamber Music Campania](#) since 2013, Fiati Five has performed in traditional and non-traditional spaces across southern Italy in the towns of Salerno, Oppidi Varano, Eboli, Contursi, Campagna, Lucera, and Gargano, as well as Sarasota, FL. Additional performances in the US have included the [Mildred Sainer Pavilion](#) at New College of Florida, the [George Eastman House](#) in Rochester, NY; outreach concerts ([Penacook Community Center, Concord](#), NH; [Havenwood Heritage Heights](#) in Concord, NH; [Trinity House-Big Bethel](#) in Atlanta, GA; and the [Community Resource Network of Florida](#) in Port Charlotte, FL); thematic concerts pairing music with a meal ([Fortina](#) in Armonk, NY; and “Savory Sounds” at [Amore by Andrea](#) in Sarasota, FL); and a performance celebrating local organic farmers (“Sustainable Sounds” at [Porter Farms](#) in Elba, NY).

Fiati Five received a generous grant from the [Mu Phi Epsilon Foundation](#) in 2015 and has been a resident at [Avaloch Farm Music Institute](#) each summer since 2014.
